In the poster you hold now, you will find information about refugees, corrections of wide-spread misinformation and signs that deliver warnings from the future. 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<p>EMERGENCY EXIT FOR FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS</p> <p>We are currently living together with 3.6 million Syrians in Turkey on the 9th year of the war.</p>			<p>WORK PERMIT</p> <p>Turkey granted work permits to a total of 32 thousand Syrians until November 2018.</p>
<p>MUTUAL HARMONY</p> <p>Turkey is currently sheltering the biggest refugee population in the world, and we are all trying to keep up with new circumstances.</p>			<p>VICIOUS CYCLE RISK</p> <p>Highly vulnerable refugees becoming dependent on outside help may force us into a vicious cycle.</p>
<p>UNDER TEMPORARY PROTECTION</p> <p>3.6 million Syrian refugees who have migrated to Turkey since 2011 are under "temporary protection" status, and are not legally considered refugees.</p>			<p>LIFE IN THE CAMPS</p> <p>140 thousand Syrians currently residing in the temporary shelters known as "refugee camps" only make up 4% of the total refugee population in Turkey.</p>
<p>BURNING BRIDGES</p> <p>53% of the Syrian population, which used to be 22 million before the war, could not return home. The average duration of forced relocations caused by a humanitarian crisis is 17 years.</p>			<p>CIVILIAN MAJORITY</p> <p>70% of the 3.6 million Syrians that have migrated to our country since the beginning of the war in 2011 are women and children.</p>
<p>GRAVE/SEA</p> <p>Unfortunately only in the first half of 2018, 1500 people dreaming of a better life lost their lives while trying to cross the Mediterranean Sea.</p>			<p>CROSSROADS</p> <p>In this critical time period where our approach to refugee issue will shape the results of our efforts, we may very well be at crossroads.</p>
<p>ELIXIR OF YOUTH</p> <p>50% of Syrians in Turkey are between the ages of 0-18. This makes about 1.7 million children and youth that have either seen the war or were born during the war.</p>			<p>ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTIONS</p> <p>Research done in countries receiving immigrants have shown that the more immigrants reside in the country, the bigger the growth is.</p>
<p>LOW INCOME AND LIMITED OPPORTUNITIES</p> <p>12% of Syrian families in Turkey live in extreme poverty, while 59% live at the average poverty rate.</p>			<p>LANGUAGE OF PEACE</p> <p>95% of Syrian refugees living in Turkey state that they want to learn Turkish.</p>
<p>NEWBORNS</p> <p>More than 400 thousand Syrian children have been born in Turkey. Syrian children born in Turkey under temporary protection face the risk of being stateless.</p>			<p>A FUTURE WITHOUT LOSS</p> <p>We must put an end to discriminatory language, and show enough maturity to adopt a humane point of view when discussing this situation.</p>
